

Our Property releases Scottish Property Data

OurProperty.co.uk has launched the first comprehensive online house price data for Scotland, thanks to a huge demand from users.

The data, which is now live, covers all sales back to 2000, although some entries go back as far as the 1950s. The data adds to OurProperty's comprehensive – and free – database, which contains house sale prices for all of England and Wales since 2000.

This is the first time the Scottish have had such great access to the data they need when purchasing a house, since the Registers of Scotland (ROS) who record house price data, charge £4.70 per search.

Fubra boss and founder of OurProperty.co.uk, Brendan McLoughlin, said “We didn't want to leave the Scots behind so we worked really hard to get the new data up, and we've had great feedback as a result.”

It is incredibly easy to use, and gives results fast. OurProperty's clever little search engine lets users search like a human would, for example you can search for properties 100 metres around a postcode as you would if you walked down a street.

Because OurProperty gives its users all the information for free it has ballooned in size since its launch in January 2005. The site now has over 250,000 registered users.
